



## Indian Film Festival of Los Angeles Screens Short Film Series and Discussion with Filmmakers at Los Angeles Asian and Tribal Art Show

The Los Angeles Asian & Tribal Art Show (LAATA) has partnered with the Indian Film Festival of Los Angeles to present a series of short films and panel discussion featuring Indian filmmakers and industry professionals. The screening and panel discussion are part of the LAATA's highly respected annual educational program of art, travel and cultural discussions, and will take place Sunday, November 15 at 1pm at the Santa Monica Civic Auditorium. The Indian Film Festival of Los Angeles will showcase four short films, *Andheri*, *Beast*, as well as the award-winning *A Day's Work* and *Take the Train*. The screening will be followed by a panel discussion with leading

Indian filmmakers and industry professionals including Sushrut Jain, Geeta Malik, Rajeev Dassani and Aryn Kaderali. In addition to the film screenings on Sunday, this year's program features an ethnic arts lecture by the Fowler Museum at UCLA Curator of the Asian & Pacific Collection, Roy Hamilton, and travel tips and advice lecture by local travel expert and owner of Distant Lands Travel Bookstore, Adrian Kalvinskas, on Saturday, November 14 starting at 12pm. The Los Angeles Asian & Tribal Art Show features more than 60 galleries showcasing a selection of authentic Asian and tribal art. Vetted to ensure quality and provenance, the LAATA is a trusted place to learn about or

purchase high-quality, authentic arts. The show is open to the public Saturday, November 14, from 11am-7pm and Sunday, November 15 from 11am-5pm. There will be no admittance after 4:30pm on Sunday. General admission, including admittance to all lectures and panel discussions and screenings, is \$10 per person. The Los Angeles Asian & Tribal Art Show opens with a benefit for the Textile Council of the Fowler Museum at UCLA on Friday, November 13 from 6-9pm. Sponsored by Art + Living Magazine, the benefit will feature lively music and a silent auction. A suggested donation of \$25 is recommended to attend the benefit.
